one point in this week's league standings although Minnesota does have two games in hand. The two rivals will square off at Kohl Center (15,325) in Madison on Friday night at 7:07 pm CT before playing again on Sunday at 3:30 pm CT in the Windy City. Minnesota is 1-0-1 vs Wisconsin so far this season, following a 2-2 (ot) tie and 3-1 victory back on Nov. 16-17 at Mariucci Arena in Minneapolis. The Gophers are 10-2-2 since Nov. 30 while the Badgers are 11-2-5 since Nov. 24.

Michigan Tech, which will first play host to CCHA-member Northern Michigan on Tuesday (Feb. 12) evening at 7:07 pm ET at John MacInnes Student Ice Arena (4,128) in Houghton, will have played five games in nine nights following the conclusion of their upcoming Friday-Saturday WCHA series at Minnesota State. The Huskies (9-14-4, 6-12-4 WCHA) will face another of the league's streaking teams in No. 9/10-ranked Minnesota State (18-9-3, 12-9-1 WCHA), as the Mavericks are an impressive 15-4-1 overall since Nov. 10 under first-year head coach Mike Hastings, a run that has seen them climb into a share of fifth place, just one point out of third and three out of second. Puck drops at Verizon Wireless Center (4,832) in Mankato are at 7:37 pm CT Friday night and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday evening. This will be the only regular season series between MSU and the Huskies, who are 5-4-1 since Christmas.

Up at Sanford Center (4,373) in Bemidji Friday and Saturday, Bemidji State looks to get back in the win column in a two-game WCHA set against Minnesota Duluth. Game times are 7:37 pm CT on Friday and 7:07 pm CT on Saturday. The Beavers (5-17-6, 4-13-5 WCHA) and Bulldogs (10-15-3, 8-11-3 WCHA) split their first series at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth on Dec. 7-8, with UMD winning 4-2 in game one and BSU prevailing 2-1 in game two.

And at Sullivan Arena (6,251) in Anchorage this coming weekend, Alaska Anchorage hopes to continue a recent surge that has seen them lose just once in their last four league games when the Seawolves entertain No. 16-ranked Nebraska Omaha in a pair of 7:07 pm AT encounters. Alaska Anchorage (4-17-7, 2-16-6 WCHA) and Nebraska Omaha (16-12-2, 12-8-2 WCHA) will play just this one regular season series against each other.

Four WCHA teams – No. 8-ranked St. Cloud State (18-11-1, 15-6-1 WCHA), No. 7-ranked North Dakota (16-8-6, 11-5-6 WCHA), No. 11-ranked Denver (15-9-5, 10-7-5 WCHA) and Colorado College (11-14-5, 8-10-4 WCHA) – are all idle this week.

With four weeks remaining in the 2012-13 regular season, the races for the WCHA championship as well as for a top six finish and a resulting first round home playoff berth continue to intensify. The regular season champion is awarded the MacNaughton Cup and earns

the No. 1 seed for the league's post-season tournament while the top six finishers in the final standings earn the home-ice advantage for the first round of WCHA Playoffs, a best-of-three series format set for the weekend of Friday-Sunday, March 15-17.

After the first round league playoffs, the six winning teams will be re-seeded No. 1 through No. 6 according to their regular season finish and advance to the 2013 Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five, which will be contested Thursday, March 21 through Saturday, March 23, at Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. The winner of the Final Five receives the Broadmoor Trophy and earns the WCHA's automatic berth into the NCAA tournament.

St. Cloud State was able to maintain a three-point cushion in the regular season league championship derby after splitting with visiting Minnesota last weekend (Feb. 8-9). The defending WCHA-champion Gophers took game one last Friday 4-2 before the Huskies battled back with a 4-3 verdict last Saturday.

St. Cloud State, in pursuit of the program's first league title after being granted admission into the WCHA for the 1990-91 campaign, stands 15-6-1 in 22 conference games for 31 points and also leads the pack in conference victories with 15, one of the key tie-breakers for determining league playoff positions. North Dakota, the three-time defending Red Baron WCHA Final Five champion, has moved into sole possession of second place this week at 11-5-6 for 28 points in 22 games, followed by a tie for third between Minnesota (20 games, 11-5-4 WCHA) and Nebraska Omaha (22 games, 12-8-2 WCHA) with 26 points apiece. UND swept UNO last weekend to gain four points,

winning 2-1 at CenturyLink Center last Friday and then taking the outdoor match up at TD Ameritrade Park on Saturday, 5-2.

Three teams are all even in fifth place with 25 points in 22 games. They are Denver at 10-7-5, Minnesota State at 12-9-1 and Wisconsin at 9-6-7. Denver was able to get just one point in their Feb. 8-9 home-and-home set with arch-rival Colorado College, tying 1-1 (ot) at Magness Arena and then falling 6-5 (ot) at Colorado Springs World Arena. Minnesota State, meanwhile, kept rolling with a 4-2, 5-1 league sweep at Minnesota Duluth, while Wisconsin earned three points from visiting Bemidji State by virtue of a 2-2 (ot) tie and 3-2 win.

Colorado College (8-10-4 WCHA) is eighth this week with 20 points but the Tigers, who are unbeaten over their last five games at 2-0-3, have moved within striking range of the top half. Minnesota Duluth (8-11-3 WCHA) is ninth this week with 19 points, Michigan Tech (6-12-4 WCHA) is 10th with 16, Bemidji State (4-13-5 WCHA) is 11th with 13 and Alaska Anchorage (2-16-6 WCHA) is 12th with 10 points. MTU split with the visiting Seawolves last weekend, falling 5-4 on Feb. 8 before storming back for a 6-1 triumph on Feb. 9 that enabled them to claim their own Winter Carnival title with a 10-6 advantage in total goals scored.

Overall last weekend, the home teams were just 4-6-2 in their 12 WCHA games, including a 0-4-2 mark last Friday (Feb. 8). And now, through 132 of the 168-game conference schedule contested as of Feb. 11, home teams are but an even .500 in league play at 54-54-24. And over the last three weekends of Jan. 25-26 (2-5-1), Feb. 1-2 (2-5-3), and Feb. 8-9 (4-6-2), home teams are just 8-16-6 (.367) in the last 30 conference games.

Looking forward to next week's slate, Nebraska Omaha will get things started with a Thursday (Feb. 21) evening home exhibition encounter with the USA Under-18 Team, followed by three WCHA series on Friday and Saturday (Feb. 22-23) that have Minnesota hosting Minnesota Duluth, Colorado College entertaining St. Cloud State, and North Dakota traveling to Denver. Then on Sunday (Feb. 24) and Monday (Feb. 25), Wisconsin will host independent Penn State for a pair of non-conference games.

Over the remainder of the regular season, there are just seven more non-conference games involving WCHA teams, with Michigan Tech hosting the CCHA's Northern Michigan on Feb. 12, Wisconsin hosting independent Penn State Feb. 24-25, Minnesota Duluth entertaining independent Alabama Huntsville on March 1-2, and Alaska Anchorage hooking up with the CCHA's Alaska also on March 1-2. WCHA-member teams own a 44-31-5 (.581) record in non-conference match ups this season. The WCHA stands 9-0-1 (.950) vs the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA), 12-15-1 (.446) against the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), 7-8-1 (.469) vs ECAC Hockey, 9-8-1 (.528) vs the Hockey East Association (HEA), and 7-0-1 (.917) vs independents. Minnesota owns the best non-conference record at a perfect 8-0-0, followed by Minnesota State at 6-0-2. Other 2012-13 non-conference records by member team are: Alaska Anchorage (2-1-1), Bemidji State (1-4-1), Colorado College (3-4-1), Denver (5-2-0), Michigan Tech (3-2-0), Minnesota Duluth (2-4-0), Nebraska Omaha (4-4-0), North Dakota (5-3-0), St. Cloud State (3-5-0), and Wisconsin (3-3-0).

In this week's USCHO.com Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued February 11, seven WCHA-member teams are again among the nation's top 20. Minnesota slips to No. 2, North Dakota is up to No. 7, St. Cloud State is up to No. 8, Minnesota State is up to No. 9, Denver is at No. 11, Nebraska Omaha is No. 16 and Wisconsin is No. 18.

And in this week's USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Division 1 Men's College Hockey Poll issued February 11, Minnesota is No. 2, North Dakota is No. 7, St. Cloud State is No. 8, Minnesota State is No. 10 and Denver is No. 11. Both Nebraska Omaha and Wisconsin also received votes.

MADISON, Wis. – The Western Collegiate Hockey Association men’s membership voted today (January 17) to admit the University of Alabama in Huntsville (UAH) as a full-time men’s conference member. The vote of approval was taken after UAH submitted an application for membership and made a formal presentation to a WCHA group of member-team Presidents and Athletic Directors at a meeting held in conjunction with the NCAA Convention in Dallas, Tex.

In issuing a joint statement on behalf of the Association, Dr. Richard Davenport, President of Minnesota State University, Mankato and Chair of the WCHA President’s Group, and Bruce McLeod, Commissioner of the WCHA, said “The WCHA is delighted to have reached in principle an agreement to officially welcome University of Alabama in Huntsville into the Association family as a full-time men’s member. This is a significant day for the Chargers, the community of Huntsville, the conference itself, and college hockey in general. Growing the game

and assisting developing programs however possible has always been a charge of the WCHA and this is another positive evolution in our history.

"Each of our member institutions are 100% committed to keeping the WCHA among the premier conferences in all of collegiate athletics and our respective ice hockey programs both strong and vibrant. The University of Alabama in Huntsville is a dynamic, top-quality institution with an excellent academic and athletic reputation and without question the Chargers are going to be a great fit and a successful, contributing member.

"Just as the entire UAH campus and the Huntsville community are exhilarated to now have a welcoming home for their men's hockey program, the WCHA is also extremely proud and gratified to be providing that home."

Said University of Alabama in Huntsville President Robert Altenkirch, "We're pleased that our ice hockey team is going to have the opportunity to compete and grow in a NCAA Division 1 conference. We believe that our affiliation with the Western Collegiate Hockey Association will be a tremendous boost to our recruiting, scheduling and our ability to be competitive on the ice.

"We want to thank the WCHA and its member institutions for their confidence in allowing us to be a part of their conference. Their affirmative vote will invigorate our ability to maintain our great hockey tradition."

UAH Director of Athletics Dr. E.J. Brophy said, "All athletic programs experience special defining moments, and our hockey program's acceptance today into the Western Collegiate Hockey Association is certainly one of those moments. The WCHA is a preeminent hockey conference in America, and I know that our student-athletes, coaches, fans, friends, alums and the people of Huntsville are ecstatic and proud of this giant step for our ice hockey program.

"The last time we were in a conference, we won the conference tournament and advanced to the NCAA tournament, which will be our immediate and ambitious goal when we begin play in the WCHA. It is a banner day for the Chargers."

The men's Western Collegiate Hockey Association, home to a record 37 national championships teams since it's founding in 1951, has been operating as a 12-team conference for the 2011-12 and 2012-13 seasons. Current members are University of Alaska Anchorage, Bemidji State University, Colorado College, University of Denver, Michigan Technological University, University of Minnesota, University of Minnesota Duluth, Minnesota State University, University of Nebraska Omaha, University of North Dakota, St. Cloud State University and University of Wisconsin.

On March 21, 2011, the Big Ten Conference announced the formation of a new Division 1 men's college hockey league that would include current WCHA-members Minnesota and Wisconsin and begin play in 2013-14. On July 13, 2012, Colorado College, Denver, Minnesota Duluth, Nebraska Omaha and North Dakota announced they would be leaving the WCHA following the 2012-13 season to form another new league, known as the National Collegiate Hockey Conference, which also begins play in 2013-14. Then on Sept. 22, 2011, St. Cloud State announced they were leaving the WCHA for the NCHC.

ABOUT UAH HOCKEY

The University of Alabama in Huntsville hockey program has been playing as an NCAA Division I independent since the end of the 2009-10 season following the dissolution of the CHA (College Hockey America). The program was dropped back to club status for a brief stint in the spring of 2012, and then revived a short time later. The program struggled to fill a 2012-13 schedule, as previously scheduled teams dropped UAH upon the canceling of the program.

Known as the "Hockey Capital of the South," UAH has been playing NCAA hockey since 1985. The program won two NCAA Division II Championships in the mid-1990's, before Div. II hockey was dropped. The program has seen massive facility upgrades, as well as a new coaching staff with professional experience and high expectations. UAH has made an appearance in six NCAA Tournaments and is currently the only DI hockey program without a home in 2013-14.

WISCONSIN CELEBRATING 50TH SEASON OF MEN'S HOCKEY IN THE MODERN ERA

For the start of the 1963-64 school year, then-Director of Athletics Ivan B. Williamson called on head coach John Riley to bring intercollegiate ice hockey back to the University of Wisconsin. The Badgers

previously had a varsity program between 1921 and 1935. Last fall, Director of Athletics Barry Alvarez and coach Mike Eaves announced a season-long celebration as the program recognizes the 50th season in the modern era of Badger hockey.

"The history of Wisconsin men's hockey is one of the strengths of the program and the entire UW athletic department and we want to take a look back at all that has been accomplished, while at the same time look forward to the coming season and the future," said Alvarez. "From the facilities, with the Kohl Center and now LaBahn Arena, to the program's tradition and fan support, there is a lot to celebrate."

In addition to the logo, which will be featured prominently on Wisconsin's jerseys, on the boards at the Kohl Center and on shirts handed out to student season-ticket holders, the program is honoring its history in other ways.

The 2012-13 season marks the 50th anniversary of Badger hockey, and also marks the 40th anniversary of the program's first NCAA title in 1973, and the 30th year since UW's fourth NCAA title in 1983. WCHA Men's Tie-Breaking Procedures - For Playoff Purposes Only

At the conclusion of the regular season, teams will be ranked by the number of points accumulated. If two teams are tied for first place, they will be declared co-WCHA champions.

The first round of the WCHA's post-season tournament will be a best-of-three games format at the home site of the teams ranked higher in the final regular season standings. All 12 teams participate in the first round of the tournament. First round playoff pairings will be: #1 rank vs #12 rank, #2 rank vs #11 rank, #3 vs #10, #4 vs #9, 5# vs #8, and #6 vs #7.

Following the six first round series, the six winning teams will be re-seeded #1 thru #6 according to their standings in the final WCHA in-season competition and will advance to the WCHA Final Five.

In the event that ties are encountered in the determination of WCHA ranking or designation of home teams for playoff purposes, the following procedures will be used in the order given to break the ties:

- a) If two or more teams are tied, head-to-head competition during the regular (conference) season will be used to break the tie.
- b) If two or more teams are still tied after (a), the highest seed will go to the team with the most WCHA (conference) wins during the regular season.
- c) If two or more teams played a four-game series during the regular season and the teams have the same win-loss records for those series and the same number of WCHA wins, the team having the least number of goals scored against it in the four-game series shall have the higher rank. If two or more teams played a two-game series during the regular season, proceed to tie-breaker d).
- d) If two or more teams are still tied after applying the provisions of (a), (b) and (c), the team having the greatest "winning margin" during the regular season will have the higher rank. Winning margin = WCHA goals for during the regular season minus WCHA goals against.
- e) Games played against WCHA opponents in holiday tournaments will not be counted in the determinations.

The Alaska Anchorage Seawolves will entertain Nebraska Omaha, Feb. 15-16, in UAA's final WCHA home series for 2012-13 ... the games are scheduled to commence at 7:07 pm AST both evenings ... this marks the only series between the teams this year ... this weekend will also double as Parent's Weekend and Senior Night on Friday ... the Seawolves will see UNO after splitting a road series at Michigan Tech, Feb. 8-9 in Houghton, Mich. ... UAA registered a come-from-behind 5-4 win last Friday, before MTU retaliated on Saturday, 6-1 ... on Friday, the Seawolves broke a 14-game winless streak and extended their unbeaten streak to three games with the win in Game 1 of the 2013 Winter Carnival ... UAA also broke a three-game losing streak to the Huskies ... the Seawolves were perfect on the man-advantage, going 2-for-2 – the first time this season UAA has posted back-to-back multi-PPG nights ... UAA also went 2-of-8 against Colorado College on Feb. 2 ... the Seawolves allowed a season-high 44 shots on goal by the Huskies, including a season-high 19 in the second period ... Junior F Jordan Kwas, who was questionable to play over the weekend with the flu, registered his second career three-point game and first multi-goal game of his career with two goals and an assist ... combined with an assist last Saturday night, Kwas extended his current point streak to six games with 3-6=9 totals in that span ... Kwas' power-play goal last Friday was his team-leading fifth of the season, while his game-winning strike was the second of his career ... Kwas owns nine career power-play goals and 15 goals at even-strength ... also posting his first career three-point game was UAA's point leader Blake Tatchell with a goal and two assists ... Tatchell leads UAA with 21 points and 14 assists ... Tatchell, who's three-game point streak with 2-4=6 totals came to an end last Saturday, currently ranks tied for No. 16 in the nation with .75 points per game ... Junior G Rob Gunderson took over in the first period last Friday and posted a season-high 36 saves, while picking up his fourth career assist and second of the season ... likewise on Saturday, Gunderson received the start, but Kamal stepped in after the first intermission and made a season-high-tying 19 saves in the second period ... scoring UAA's lone goal at MTU last Saturday was sophomore F Scott Allen – his team-leading 11th of the season ... Allen also picked up an assist on Tatchell's goal last Friday ... following the UNO weekend, the Seawolves will have a bye week before seeing in-state rival Alaska Fairbanks for a home-and-home series on March 1-2.

BEMIDJI STATE

The Bemidji State University men's hockey team traveled to University of Wisconsin last weekend and escaped with one point ... The Beavers battled back from a pair of one-goal deficits to earn a 2-2 overtime tie in the series-opener last Friday and snap a four-game losing skid ... On Saturday, trailing 3-0 midway through the second period, the Beavers scored two unanswered goals, but were unable to complete the comeback and fell 3-2 ... BSU is 5-17-6 overall and 4-13-5 in WCHA play and currently sits 11th in the league standings with 13 points ... With a tie last Friday, the Beavers have now garnered at least one point from each of the 11 other members of the WCHA since joining the league ranks prior to the 2010-11 season ... BSU is now 0-6-1 versus Wisconsin all-time and is 0-3-1 when facing the Badgers at Kohl Center ... The Badgers remain the only current WCHA member BSU has never beaten ... The Beavers remain winless in their last 12 games (0-9-3), marking the longest string of games without a win since Dec. 2, 2000 to Feb. 3, 2001 (0-13-2) – Bemidji State's inaugural season at the NCAA Division 1 level ... BSU finished that season 4-24-4 ... During BSU's current 12-game winless skid, seven contests have been decided by a goal or less ... Both of the Beavers' goals last Friday were unassisted ... Phil Brewer scored at the 10:49 mark of the second and Danny Mattson converted a turnover into a goal at 6:08 of the third ... BSU has just four unassisted goals in 2012-13 ... The last time BSU netted a pair of unassisted goals in the same game was Oct.

7, 2011 at Miami ... That night, Aaron McLeod and former Beaver Darcy Findlay each scored an unassisted tally ... BSU had played 64 games since ... Brance Orban continues to lead the Beavers in scoring with 18 points (6g, 12a), while Aaron McLeod owns the Beavers' top goal-scoring mark with 11, and Orban is tied with Danny Mattson for the team's top assist spot with 12 ... This season, BSU is 4-4-1 when scoring three or more goals, 1-13-5 when netting less than three goals and is 1-14-1 when its opponents have met the three-goal threshold ... This season BSU has been outshot in 21 of 28 games and is trailing its opponents 877-675 in the shot department for an average of -7.2 shots on goal per game ... BSU is 3-13-4 when being outshot in 2012-13, 2-2-1 when out-shooting its opponent and 0-2-1 when the shots are even ... Last Saturday, Aaron McLeod scored while BSU was on the power-play – snapping a string of eight games and 19 power-play opportunities without a goal (0-for-19), the streak as the longest stretch without a power-play goal in BSU's Division 1 era ... McLeod's goal was his team-leading 11th of the season ... It also increases his career single-season high ... On the season, the Beavers are now 13-for-81 (.160) on the man-advantage with 11 power-play goals coming in 22 WCHA games ... The Beavers are 11-for-62 (.177) in WCHA play to rank ninth in the league in power-play efficiency ... BSU's penalty-kill unit held Wisconsin scoreless on seven of its eight power-play opportunities last weekend to move to 86-for-107 (.804) on the season, while it has stymied 69-of-84 opponent power-play chances in WCHA play to sit sixth in the league (.821) ... The BSU penalty-kill unit has allowed just two power-play goals in its last eight games and 22 opponent man-advantage chances (.909) ... BSU is winless (0-9-4 (.154) on Fridays in 2012-13, while it is 5-5-2 (.500) in Saturday contests and 0-1-0 (.000) on Sundays and 0-1-0 (.000) on Mondays ... BSU has held a lead for just 7:59 in its last 381:54 minutes of play – a span stretching seven games ... Last Friday's third-period goal by Danny Mattson was the Beavers' first goal in the final frame of regulation since Jan. 25 versus Nebraska-Omaha ... It also marked the first deciding goal cast by the Beavers since Dec. 15, when Brance Orban netted the game-winner versus Denver ... BSU has been outscored 27-16 during the third period in 2012-13 ... Last Friday's third-period comeback marks just the second time this season BSU has come back to earn a point when trailing after two periods ... BSU also scored two goals in the third session of a Nov. 23 game versus Alaska Anchorage to force overtime and gain a draw, 2-2 ... BSU returns to Sanford Center this weekend to host the University of Minnesota Duluth ... The Beavers and Bulldogs split a two-game series earlier this season (Dec. 7-8) in Duluth ... BSU trails UMD 11-22-1 in a series that got its start in 1948 ... however, since the 2005-06 season, BSU is 9-7-1 versus the Bulldogs, which includes a 3-1-1 mark in games played on the Beavers home ice during that stretch.

COLORADO COLLEGE

The Tigers, who enjoy a bye week before playing host to league-leading St. Cloud State on Feb. 22 and 23, will head into that series with a season-best five-game (2-0-3) undefeated streak ... Last Saturday's 6-5 overtime triumph marked Colorado College's first sudden-death victory at home in more than a year – since beating the same Denver team (4-3) on Dec. 2, 2011 ... Despite surrendering the Gold Pan by virtue of last Friday's 1-1 tie with the Pioneers at Magness Arena, CC has claimed the trophy 11 times in its 20 seasons of existence ... The Tigers now are 20-9-4 (.667) in 33 all-time meetings with arch-rival DU at the Colorado Springs World Arena since opening the venue in January 1998 ... They've lost only eight of their last 29 meetings overall between the teams dating back to the 2005-06 campaign, going 13-8-8 (.586) in the rivalry during that stretch ... Freshman winger Hunter Fejes, whose second goal of the night ended last Saturday's contest with :10.5 seconds left in overtime, became the eighth different Colorado College player to score a game winner in 2012-13 ... Minnesota is coming off a WCHA split with St. Cloud State last weekend, opening the series with a 4-2 win before falling 4-3 in the finale ... Minnesota's leading scorer this year with 35 points (13g, 22a), Erik Haula ranks tied for seventh in the national scoring race and sits tied for fifth in the WCHA scoring race ... junior Nick Bjugstad leads the Gophers with 15 goals this season ... sophomore Kyle Rau is tied for second in the nation this season with five game-winning goals ... Minnesota boasts the nation's top offense this season with an average of 3.75 goals per game and 105 total offensive goals ... the Gophers also rank fourth nationally in scoring defense (1.93 goals against per game), third nationally on the power-play (32-for-127, .252) and sixth nationally in penalty-killing (77-for-87, .885) ... Minnesota leads the WCHA in all four categories while the Gophers are the only team in the nation to be ranked in the top 10 for all four categories ... the Gophers have scored four or more goals in 12 of the last 14 games and have outscored opponents 57-25 during that stretch ... Minnesota is now 8-3-3 this season against nationally-ranked opponents with another ranked opponent this weekend in the Badgers.

Eight of the last 14 meetings between the two intrastate rivals have been decided by one goal or less and five have required overtime ... The only game during that stretch with a margin of victory of more than two goals for either club came on Oct. 28, 2012 – a 6-2 Bulldog triumph in Duluth ... The Bulldogs were ambushed twice last weekend (4-2 and 5-1) by Minnesota State University, Mankato at AMSOIL Arena in the final two legs of a four-game homestand ... In the opener, UMD took a 2-1 lead into the final period, getting goals from rookie left winger Austin Farley and senior right winger Mike Seidel, only to be outscored 3-0 and outshot 22-7 in the final 20 minutes of regulation ... Freshman center Tony Cameranesi accounted for the lone UMD score on Saturday ... UMD's rookie class is the eighth highest-scoring group in the country at the moment amassing 62 points on 25 goals and 37 assists ... Center Tony Cameranesi is tied for fifth nationally in freshmen scoring with 25 points and is second among WCHA newcomers in that department (two points back of St. Cloud State's Kalle Kossila) ... Cameranesi's seven power-play goals this season are the fifth most of any NCAA skater – and tops among freshmen – while his 3.71 shots per game average ranks fourth in the nation ... Left winger Austin Farley, who figured in on all three Bulldog goals last weekend against Minnesota State, is the WCHA's sixth-highest rookie point producer (21) and Andy Welinski, holds down the No. 2 slot on the WCHA first-year defensemen scoring charts with two goals and 10 assists – nine points back of frontrunner Nolan Zajac of Denver ... Welinski snapped an eight-game pointless drought (which dated back to Dec. 15) with an assist in Friday's 4-2 setback to Minnesota State ... The Bulldogs are currently mired in a five-game losing streak – their longest slump since they also dropped five straight between Feb. 22-March 7, 2008 ... The last time UMD lost more games in a row was in 2005-06 when it closed out the regular season by going 0-6-0 ... Senior right winger Mike Seidel, who has held down the top spot on the UMD scoring chart since the opening weekend of the 2012-13 season, is tied for 15th in the WCHA in points with 27, for 10th in goals (13), for fifth in power-play points (14),

and for sixth in game-winners with three ... He also has six power-play goals to his credit (with his last coming at Michigan Tech on Dec. 1), a number bettered by only two other WCHA combatant (Cameranesi and Minnesota State's Eriah Hayes with 10) ... Back on the blue line, senior Wade Bergman has accumulated two goals (both game-winners, which is tops among all WCHA pointmen) and 13 assists for 15 points ... That's the 12th most of any WCHA defenseman in 2012-13 and three points shy of his career high, which he set last winter ... The Bulldogs have struck at least once with the man-advantage in all 19 of their 28 season and currently possess the WCHA's fifth most efficient power-play at 20.6% ... Of UMD's 70 total goals this season, 27 have come on the power-play ... That figures out to be 38.6% – the third highest total in the nation (behind only Union College at 41.5 and Western Michigan University at 41.4%) ... The Bulldogs are 3-5-1 when they've been held scoreless on the power-play this season and 7-3-2 when the opposition has failed to convert with the man-advantage ... In its 10 victories to date, the Bulldogs have killed 39-of-42 power-plays (92.3%) ... Sophomore center Caleb Herbert sat out last Saturday's clash with Minnesota State while nursing an injury ... The reigning UMD Rookie of the Year Award winner hadn't missed a game since the start of the 2011-12 season (68 straight) prior to that ... In their last 10 games, UMD has scored just three times in final period of regulation while allowing 16 goals ... Crandall, a two-time WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipient, gave up five goals on 24 shots to Minnesota State and was replaced by freshman Alex Fons, who turned aside all four Maverick shots he faced in the last 7:08 of play in his Bulldog debut ... UMD has given up three shorthanded goals this winter – including one each in both of its Florida College Hockey Classic bouts in late December – after ceding just two during all of 2011-12 ... On the flip side, the Bulldogs have collected only two shorties over the past two seasons – by sophomore center/wing Adam Krause (his first collegiate tally) at Michigan Tech on Nov. 30 of this year and Keegan Flaherty (also at Michigan Tech on Dec. 2, 2011) ... Senior center Jake Hendrickson has now made 93 successive appearances stretching back to Dec. 30, 2010 – the longest ironman streak of any active Bulldog.

The Los Alamitos, Calif., native is tied for tenth in the country in points and is sixth in assists ... Leitner, who led the Mavericks in scoring last year as a freshman, ranks second in the country in power-play points with 20 and has not missed a game in his two-year MSU career with 68 straight appearances ... Knight reached the 40-point plateau for the third straight season, making him the first UND player to do so since T.J. Oshie and Ryan Duncan both did it in 2007-08 ... Kristo, who leads the WCHA with 18 goals, reached the 20-assist plateau for the fourth straight year, the first UND player with 20-plus assists in each of his four years since Jeff Panzer from 1997 to 2001 ... Freshman Zane Gothberg earned the win both nights, stopping 62 of 65 shots (.954 save percentage) ... Gothberg has started six of UND's last seven games, losing only once (3-1-2) with a 1.96 goals-against average and a .935 save percentage ... His .778 winning percentage during league play leads the WCHA, and his .926 save percentage ranks third ... Gothberg's overall save percentage of .918 is the third-lowest by a freshman in UND history ... A UNO power-play goal during the third period last Saturday snapped UND's streak of 18 consecutive successful penalty-kills ... UND is 3-0-1 to start the month of February and has now gone 39-7-3 (.827) after January since 2009-10 ... The Huskies will enjoy a bye week on Feb. 15-16 before returning to league action on Feb. 22 and Feb. 23 with a pair of games at Colorado College ... SCSU Hobey Baker Memorial Award candidate Drew LeBlanc leads the country with 30 assists this season but it was his time to score goals on Feb. 8-9 ... LeBlanc notched his ninth marker of the season on Feb. 8 and then scored the game-winner on Feb. 9 with his goal at 6:40 of the third period ... LeBlanc now has 30 assists and 10 goals, which makes him just one of four Division 1 players with 40-plus points scored so far in 2012-13 ... He owns a five-game point-scoring streak for the Huskies and he currently ranks eighth in the team record with 137 career points (39g, 98a) ... SCSU rookie Joey Benik scored his first collegiate goal on Feb. 8, 2013 ... SCSU freshman Jonny Brodzinski scored his team-leading 14th goal of the season on Feb. 9 against Minnesota ... Brodzinski ranks second in the nation among D1 rookies with 14 goals this season ... Brodzinski has played in all 30 games for the Huskies this season with 23 points to his credit ... SCSU defender Nick Jensen charted his 20th assist of the year on Feb. 9 ... Jensen is now tied for second among D1 blueliners with 20 helpers in 2012-13 ... In his sterling career at SCSU, Jensen now has 14 goals and 64 assists for a total of 78 points ... In the team's career scoring charts, Jensen moves ahead of Husky legend Bret Hedican who had 77 points during his career ... Jensen also moved into second place in the SCSU records for assists by a defenseman with 64 ... He moves past Taj Melson, who had 63 assists from 1992-96 ... The team's all-time leader for assists by a defenseman is Kelly Hultgren with 79 from 1991-95 ... The Huskies allowed a season-high 42 shots on net on Feb. 8 in the 4-2 loss to UM ... Sophomore goalie Ryan Faragher had a busy weekend as he hit a season-high with 38 saves against the Gophers on Feb. 8 and he backed that up with 36 saves in the 4-3 win on Feb. 9 ... On the season, Faragher is 17-9-1 with a 2.19 goals-against average and a .918 save rate ... In WCHA play, Faragher owns a .738 win rate and 2.04 goals-against average ... Since Jan. 1, Faragher is 6-1-1 in WCHA play with a 1.75 GAA and a .939 save rate to his credit ... Dowd scored his 13th goal of the year at 17:48 of the second period and also added his 18th assists on the year on Jonny Brodzinski's goal ... Dowd is enjoying a career season at SCSU with season-highs of 31 points, 13 goals and 18 assists ... He is a resident of Huntsville, Alabama ... The Finnish freshman Kalle Kossila keeps putting points on the board for the Huskies ... In 28 games this year, Kossila ranks third on the team with 27 points (12g, 15a) ... He ranks fourth in the nation among D1 rookies with 27 points in 2012-13 ... SCSU ranks ninth in the nation in scoring with an average of 3.30 goals per game ... SCSU ranks 16th in the nation on defense with an average of 2.40 goals allowed per game ... SCSU ranks last in the nation for penalty minutes per game this season at 8.5 penalty minutes per game ... The Huskies have outshot their opponents 872-786 in 2012-13.
